Statement of Attainment UETTDRRF06B: Perform rescue from a live low voltage (LV) panel

This Unit of Competence (UOC) covers the performance of rescue procedures from a simulated live Low Voltage (LV) apparatus, not including overhead lines and underground cables in the work place. It specifies the mandatory requirements of performing a rescue from a live LV panel and how they apply in the context of transmission, distribution or rail work functions.

It encompasses responsibilities for health, safety and risk management processes at all operative levels and adherence to safety practices as part of the normal way of doing work.

The Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) component is presented in accordance with the current guidelines of the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC).

Participants train on resuscitation manikins and use a Low Voltage Rescue (LVR) kit and demonstrate competency in performing a simulated LVR rescue encompassing (CPR).

There are three elements to this UOC:

1. Prepare to Perform Rescue Procedures from a simulated Live LV Panel:

- ✓ Risk assessment and control measures taken by the individual performing the rescue
- ✓ Electricity isolation point is identified and labeled where appropriate
- ✓ LVR kit checked for safety, functionality and placed in an accessible location to facilitate response and rescue according to established procedures.

2. Perform a simulated rescue from live LV panel

- ✓ Workplace procedures and work instructions for controlling risk are followed during the rescue
- ✓ Workplace procedures for accessing and isolating the LV panel and removing the victim, where necessary, from contact with live apparatus are followed.
- ✓ Workplace procedures for applying CPR if required at the site and gaining access to treatment by a medical professional if necessary are followed.
- ✓ The worksite is secured and entry controlled until appropriate authorities inspect and release the site.

3. Complete the LV Panel Rescue Procedure

- ✓ Processes for reporting accidents and/or incidents to authorised personnel are confirmed in accordance with established procedures.

- **TRAINING DURATION** 4 hours face-to-face training
- **QUALIFICATION DURATION** Every 12 months from date of issue
- **ASSESSMENT**
 1. PRACTICAL:
 - ✓ Demonstrate competent rescue from a simulated LVR panel, encompassing CPR
 - ✓ Participants must demonstrate two minutes of continuous CPR on an adult mannequin placed on the floor.
 2. THEORY:
 - ✓ True/false, multiple choice and short answer questions
